**Gary DeFayette****District Governor****District 13 OH6****Taking Off!**

Last month, I wrote about the Official beginning of my term as District Governor and our new district. I also mentioned that Lions Clubs International will be observing its 100th year anniversary. This is our opportunity to recall the long and strong history of Lions service to mankind. We have a tradition that makes up proud to be Lions. It is up to us to ensure that Lions Clubs International continues for future generations, by building a stronger organization now! I have stated before how so few members have done so much! If we all dedicate ourselves now, our new district won't just survive but it will grow and get us off on solid footing for the future. International President Bob Corlew's metaphor of "New Mountains to Climb" implies that this activity has challenges. Challenges that we can conquer given good planning, determination and teamwork. When closely considered there is a large difference between why mountain climbers climb mountains and what Lions are doing as a service organization. Also, please update your club officers and members in MyLCI if you haven't already completed this requirement for our new year.



A great opportunity to live out our motto, "WE SERVE" has come your way.

From January 20-27, 2017, a group of Lions from Ohio in conjunction with the Clayland Lions and Imagine Missions will be making a trip to Des Piños, Haiti. While there, we will visit the Loyal Oaks Community Chapel Orphanage; spend time with the children; get to know these wonderful young men and women; work on some service projects or one large project in the community and/or at the orphanage; and with some luck, we will be able to meet up with the Lions Club in Cabaret, Haiti.

This opportunity is being offered to the first 16 individuals to commit by paying an initial \$200 deposit by August 1, 2016. Yes, for those of you wondering, spouses are welcome, and no they don't have to be Lions members.

While on this trip, lodging as well as three meals a day will be provided. We will be within walking distance from the orphanage and get to experience not only another culture, but learn of the daily life challenges which face the Northern Hemisphere's most impoverished country.

As a team, our goal will be to complete one large project. A list has been established based upon the needs of the orphanage and there are several project opportunities that can be done to help the community as well. Together, we can look over and discuss possible projects based on available funds from your own clubs, personal donations, and fundraising.

Currently, roundtrip Airfare is approximately \$800 per person with room and board costing \$40 per day or \$280 for the seven day trip. (Please keep in mind, based on booking times our price with the airlines may change.)




40th USA-Canada Lions Leadership Forum
