In Memoriam

Past International Director Floyd Newberry



Floyd Newberry, Jr., age 87 of Sardinia, Ohio died Friday, January 13, 2017 at the Hospice of Hope Ohio Valley Inpatient Center in Seaman, Ohio. He was a retired real estate appraiser, a member of the Mt. Orab Lions Club, the New Harmony Masonic Lodge F&AM #435, the Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite Valley of Cincinnati and the Syrian Shrine.

"He was a mentor, excellent leader, friend, and an awesome Lion. I loved to sit down and just listen to him. He was full of knowledge and always trying to make you laugh. I would absorb everything like it was a sponge. He was an individual that wanted to see you exceed in life.

He believed in helping other and making a difference in communities. He was a charter member for 65 years and had perfect attendance in Mt. Orab Lions Club. He became District Governor in 1984-85. Council Chair for the state of Ohio in 1985-86. Then he became International Director in 1995 and served from 1995-1997. He dedicated his life by the motto of Lions Club International, We Serve."

"Are you ready to say "Yes?"

It isn't too early to consider Lions for Leadership roles. I believe now is a good time to start looking for our replacements. Getting Lions to volunteer for positions of Leadership is always a challenge and usually very time consuming. There always seems to be a reason why someone is unwilling or unable to accept this kind of service. The fact that we are all volunteers means that accepting a Club Officer position isn't mandatory. While some Club Secretaries and Club Treasurers stay in their respective positions, year after year, because they truly enjoy doing these jobs for their clubs, often it is because nobody else is willing to replace them. I believe that there are club members who are willing to accept Leadership positions if they were asked and offered the necessary training. We shouldn't assume anybody wouldn't be able to serve because we think they are not interested. Only after we ask a Lion can we be sure of their thoughts and feelings.

I want to encourage our Lions to consider serving wherever they can to gain experience and self-confidence to be able to serve as future Officers. Working on Club committees, becoming a Club Director or Club Vice President are all beneficial to both the Club and the individual members. There is District supplied classroom training offered as well as on-line training courses through the LCI web site at the following link: http://www.lionsclubs.org/EN/member-center/leadership-development/news-train-club-officers.php. The winter is an ideal time to take courses since we are usually stuck indoors.

Start getting your Lion's club Officer team together now by having a nominating committee in place so that your club elections can be completed by April 15, 2017 per the Constitution and By-Laws mandate. We also will need to plan on District Officer staffing for the next DG. I would like to ask Club Presidents to consider taking a Zone Chair position. With 9 Zone Chair positions to fill I'm sure your help would be greatly appreciated in identifying interested Lions.

It may appear to be early to think of next year's Lion Leaders now but I don't want to have to put Lions in a position where they feel that they weren't given enough time to think about it or to determine what Leadership role they would be interested in filling. I would like to think when asked, our Lions will say Yes!

Please consider volunteering to serve as a Lion Leader. I am offering to answer any questions you may have and to provide training information as requested. There is not commitment required or expected if you want to ask about leadership in the Lions. For my part, I'm in the company of many dedicated Lions that I consider my friends!

I have been to several clubs that were inducting new members, and this is truly an uplifting sight. Unfortunately, we are still bleeding more than gaining.

There are two things I would like to see happen. If your club has not gained any new members in the last two years, your members should gather all club members to go over what they think is needed in your community. All members need to input and no member should dominate the discussion. So try having a community needs assessment meeting. The best way is to limit each member to 2—3 minutes each, and then have 3—5 minutes of discussion on any project or fundraising event that gets traction. If you come up with one or two new ideas that everyone agrees upon, then break it down as to how it will be achieved. Don't hesitate to call upon churches, other community organizations, or other Lions Clubs in your zone for input and bodies to work the event.

It's easy to stay stationary and fade away, but remember that a group of people joined together and formed your club, so keep the legacy going.



Many years ago, I read a "Reader's Digest" article and it stuck with me. Whenever we have a friend hurting, we tell them "if there's anything you need, just call". Well the reality is that when they are hurting or in shock they don't know what to ask for! The man in this article didn't ask that question. He went to the home of the deceased and asked for all the family's dress shoes and cleaned and polished them for the funeral. He knew this would be helpful. No one would ever ask for that.

The next time instead of saying, "if there's anything you need, just call", put your words into ACTION and do a project for this hurting family. It doesn't have to be much to make an impact!

LCIF Core 4 Grant for \$25,000 approved to expand Lions Quest in Ohio.

Ohio Department of Education (ODE) indicates there are 1,939,851 students, K-12 grades, attending over 1400 school districts, public and private in Ohio. There are approximately 64,662 teachers. The training cost is approximately \$150/teacher + \$150/teacher kit (materials).

During the past 25 years, over 9,500 teachers have completed a Lions Quest Workshop which enables them to teach and purchase the Lions Quest Materials.






