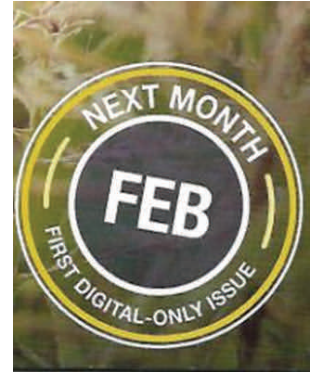

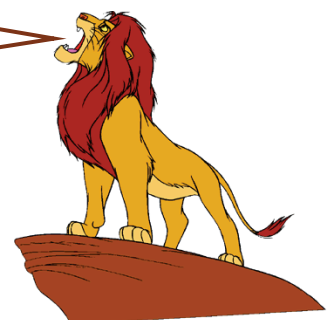

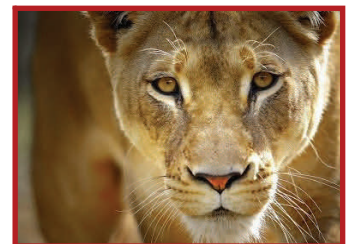

### The XL Generation

During 2018 let's add to our "Things-to-do List" and focus on ourselves. If we feel better, our enthusiasm will be reflected in our output which is contagious. We can serve the world one pound at a time.

A generation is a group of people with similar characteristics based on their date of birth. Such as births prior to 1944 is called the Greatest Generation; followed by the Baby Boomers; X Gen; Y Gen; and from 1980 – 2000 the Millennials. Across all generations are people of the XL Generation regardless of their date of birth.

Written by Allan Boruskek in his 2018 edition of "The Calorie King, Calorie Fat & Carbohydrate" page 10 is the following:

"Some 15% of American kids and adolescents are overweight; and childhood obesity has doubled over the last 20 years. Diabetes, high blood pressure and high cholesterol are major problem areas for overweight children and adolescents, as are depression, low self-esteem, sleep apnea and bone joint problems.

To address this problem, cooperation is required between kids, parents, schools and government. Weight control is a family and community affair."

This phenomenon of obesity is not only in our youth, but it's apparent in the adult population. Do you or your community or club members have issues with weight control or obesity? I do. For my 6' frame my healthy weight range is 145 – 182 and my healthy range for body mass index (BMI) is 177-184. Currently, I'm approaching the red zone or Morbid Obesity (very High Risk). What about you ~ can we decrease our health risk in 2018?

**Action:** Arrange and provide moral support for yourself and others:

- Gain the support of family, friends, and club members. Eat & Drink Sensibly, Exercise Daily.
- Get extra professional help if required, from your doctor, dietitian, psychologist, exercise trainer, or slimming group. (maybe a club can program)
- Beware of saboteurs who discourage you from adopting a healthier lifestyle?

Our greatest gift is our health. Lionism is about sharing our wealth with those less fortunate. Take care of your most important asset! Get out of the XL Generation.

### As the Global Service Team Coordinator:

- Work with the Zone Chairs and Region Chairs to have *each* club appoint one of their members to be a “GST Club Service Chair”. *This appointment needs to be identified in MYLCI* and contact will be made with the appointed members to ensure they understand the need for this position and encourage the clubs to report their activities and service projects through MYLCI.
- Provide information each month through the newsletter and pass along to the zone and region chairs.
- Promote club participation in all 5 areas of the Lions Centennial Service Challenge Campaign—the newest ones are Diabetes and Pediatric Cancer Research.
- Assist clubs in identifying service projects that serve the maximum number of people per dollar and hour. Encourage Zone and District Service Projects.
- Train members who need help to properly utilize MYCLI and provide information on the public relations resources in order to successfully promote their service projects locally.

We need clubs to identify a member of the club as a “Club Service Chair” and work with me to implement an action plan for participation in the Centennial Service Challenge. More Helping hands mean stronger clubs and better communities.

**CERTIFICATION OF DELEGATES**

LCI By Laws Article IX, Section 3. Each chartered club in good standing in the association and its district (single, sub-, provisional, multiple) is entitled to one delegate and one alternate delegate for each 10 members who have been enrolled in the club for at least one year and one day, or major fraction thereof as shown by the records of the International Office on the first day of the month last preceding that month during which the convention is held (April 1 for this convention). The International Constitution and By Laws further provide that each club in good standing shall be entitled to a minimum of one delegate and one alternate delegate at its district convention. The major fraction referred to in this section shall be five or more members. Any club newly chartered and any other club that takes in new members prior to the convening of any such convention shall have its delegate quota determined on the basis of members who have been enrolled in the club for at least one year and a day. Delinquent dues may be paid and good standing acquired at any time prior to the close of credential certification as such closing time shall be established by the rules of the respective convention.

Furthermore, all Past District Governors of Sub-District 13 OH6 in good standing shall be considered Delegates-at-Large to this convention and are entitled to one vote in addition to the delegate quota of their respective clubs.

**Vandalia Lioness:** The club welcomed a new Lioness in November, Lioness Shirley Greene. Welcome!



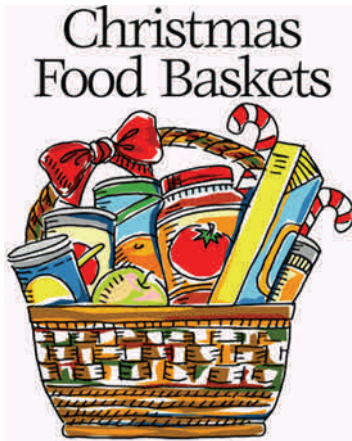
