We had a display of Peace Poster and Veterans Home poster contest entries. We have talent in this district!



MAY - "Real NEWS!"

Have you read a great news-article lately? Newspapers, newsletters, magazines, pamphlets, handouts, and social media are inundated with articles.

NEWS: Implies something has or is expected to happen, or perhaps something the reader doesn't know, informative. It may be old stuff, but it's new to someone! Usually, news can answer self-imposed questions or instructs the reader on what needs to be done. Considering the volume of written material, nothing is new. Generally, writers add spice to issues by adding their perspective and quote research for creditability. Perspective can be influenced by past events. During a life/death event, who cares about who is leading in the playoffs. We all have our own priorities, and sometimes I'll read the newsletter and sometimes I don't.

While working on my Master's Degree at the University of North Florida, my advisor gave me a small book, maybe 90 pages, titled "Mastery Learning" and asked me to read it, and he would explain what I needed to do for my thesis. He said, "You don't know enough to understand what I want you to do." I read the book and scheduled an appointment with my advisor. He started asking me questions about the in-depth contents of the book, which I was unprepared to answer. He did not want me to just read the book, he expected me to comprehend and apply the concepts to other situations.

The point is that news article writers, expect that the reader will comprehend the data, use and apply the concepts. However, readers often are just like me! Quickly scan and never act.

The lack of questioning and comprehension the details of issues leave us as a contributor to the problem, instead of being part of the solution. Without understanding, verification and application of data (NEWS) leaves us without the knowledge to take positive actions that will make a difference. As I write news-articles my intent is to grow and expand community service.

Do you question the research that's offered to legitimize solutions? Do you accept the notions that some things are impossible? What standard do you impose on NEWS? My ole papa said; "believe nothing you hear and only half of what you see".

It's time to provoke in-depth thinking about real-issues affecting your club. During 2018-19 Lions Year I'll be working on real issues and attempting to provide "Real-NEWS". Your job will be to dissect, question, research, and work toward solutions.


She told a moving story about how the Lions provided the money to allow her mother to get cornea transplants. There weren't many dry eyes in the crowd.
