Additionally, she has served as a committee member for the USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum, multinational coordinator for Campaign SightFirst II, secretary for the Lions Evebank (Alberta) Society, Vice President of the Lions Eve Research Institute of Northern Alberta and presenter at many forums and conventions. Dr Hill is a founding member of the Lions of Canada Consultative Committee. In recognition of her service to the association, International President Hill has received numerous awards, including several International President's Awards. She has been honored with the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association bestows upon its members. She is also a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow, and recipient of numerous other fellowships. Spring has sprung, and the "sprung" has had one unpleasant surprise. The March 14 EF3 tornado in Logan County of OH1 was terribly destructive. In the wake of this disaster, local residents and businesses responded swiftly and started relief efforts almost as soon as the tornado departed. The Logan County United Way has provided the infrastructure for the coordination of these efforts. As a result, OH1 leaders (DG Deb Crawford and Cabinet) have partnered with the LCUW. OH1 has collected, either directly or by commitments, over \$31,000 at this writing. As the LCUW informs OH1 of needs, these funds will be used to supply those needs. Due to the severity of the tornado, filling these needs will be a long term project. If you or your club wish to donate to this relief and recovery effort, you may make a direct contribution to Lions District OH1. Make sure to add tornado relief on the memo line. Send the check to CT/PDG John Davis, 933 Thornapple Lane, Findlay, Ohio 45840. If you wish to make a tax-deductible donation, go to the Logan County United Way website, www.uwlogan.org, and find the "donation" tab. The site automatically creates a digital receipt when a donation is finalized. If you want to have your donation recognized as a Lions offering, after your name use a dash and give a Lions designation. For example, Jane Doe – OH1 Lions or John Doe - Western Hills Lions would go on the name line. Make sure your name matches the way it is listed on the credit card you are using to make the donation. Let me offer two thoughts as we move through the District Convention Season. First, don't wait to elect your officers. My challenge is to submit those names to the International by May 15. Second, don't wait to see who plans to remain in your club. Seek out club members who have been absent

or inactive and find out how you can keep them involved. We are doing an excellent job of adding new members (722 to date), but we need to work on keeping these new Lions and reinvigorating the longtime members of our clubs. Let all our members know how important they are to our mission – new voices and old voices alike! Attention to Retention is essential. Orientation and training play a key role in retention. So does active Service. We Serve. Best wishes in the coming months; enjoy family and friends during the solar eclipse gatherings, spring break, and Spring blossoming. CC Dave Stockum

Business/Elections, Seminars, Spouse's Program, raffles, meals, hospitality, etc. Plan



Shall the International Relations Committee be removed from Article III, Section 5, page 18 of the MD-13 Ohio Lions By-Laws, of the most recent version dated July 29, 2023 and the MD-13 Ohio Lions Policy Manual Section 1, Chapter 5, page 4?

Rationale: Based on a recommendation from the Finance & Long-Range Planning Committee. The function of the International Relations Committee has recently become moot as one of the main beneficiaries of their funding is no longer in existence at Kent State University.

If approved by a 2/3 majority of registered delegates at the MD-13 Ohio Lions 2024 State Convention, this measure will become effective July 1, 2024

It's time!!

Lions, it is finally here! The new <u>Lion Portal</u> is set to go live APRIL 15, 2024!



What does this mean for us?

<u>Thursday</u>, <u>April 11</u> is <u>the last day</u> for Lions to access anything in the MyLCI - MyLion - Insights systems. It is the last day to input service projects, the last day to check statements or contact information, the last day to input officers or new members *in those systems*.

No system will be available online the weekend of April 12-14.

April 15 to May 13, Lions who have an active account on MyLCI/MyLion will receive an email inviting them to log into the new Lion Portal and create their password. DO NOT PANIC IF YOU DO NOT GET YOUR EMAIL APRIL 15.

After May 13, All visitors attempting to access the previous digital tools will be automatically redirected to the new portal.

Preparation is underway to begin rolling out the new Lion Portal. Here is some important information to prepare you for launch.

Phased rollout for Lion Account Users

Our target launch window is April 15 – May 13*. During this time, all current Lion Account users will receive an email inviting them to access the new Lion Portal**. We're doing this phased rollout to ensure staff are available to provide the best support possible and offer you a positive introductory experience.

April 15 – May 13: Invitations to access the new Lion Portal sent via email on a rolling basis to existing Lion Account users.

Please note: User permissions will not change. In other words, those who can report service, access member data and other key functions remains the same.

May 13 and beyond: All visitors attempting to access the previous digital tools will be automatically redirected to the new Lion Portal.



Glasses Collections and Drop Off's to Glass Collection POCs

Collecting used glasses to include prescription, sunglasses and reading glasses are one of the many tasks that our Lions do. If you collect glasses, please contact one of our Eye Glasses Collection POCs (Lions Patrick Bookman (513-689-2379) and Mike Hathaway (740-703-3943)) to get them to them. Please do not wait until you have 20,000 pairs. You can make arrangements to meet them, have them attend a club meeting and talk about the program, meet them at a Zone meeting, etc. Sometimes, a Zone Chairperson will even collect them for the POCs, but you need to make sure you arrange this prior to bringing a bunch of glasses to a meeting for them to take. The glasses are an important part of the Lions vision program, and it does us no good to hold on to them. They need to be collected and taken to our POCs so that they can get them out to those in need of them. Sight should never be taken for granted and if we can help someone see better, we have done a great service. Please ensure that all glasses are counted and boxed up (no bags please).

- Packing boxes should be marked with the number of glasses contained and the name of the club supplying them.
- Packing boxes should be of manageable size (20 to 30 pounds).
- Clubs delivering glasses to the collection points should submit their MAR information for credit. The collection point will not do that for individual clubs.

Greetings from the OLPCF (Ohio Lions Pediatric Cancer Foundation).

The OLPCF was founded in 2019 to fill several needs relating to pediatric cancer: to help fund, through grants, research to provide cures; to provide financial assistance to families dealing with a child who has cancer; and to provide a tax-exempt restricted fund option for clubs who are working with other foundations and/or families in need.

To date, we have been able to provide \$25,000 grants in each of our first 3 years in existence, and we have helped a number of families as well. As we continue to grow, our ability to reach out will be even greater.

Pediatric cancer is actually over 100 diseases lumped under one umbrella. It is the #1 killer by disease in children. 17,000 children are diagnosed every year in the United States alone, with the average age of 10 at the time of diagnosis, and the symptoms can often be very subtle and easy to miss. Gender, race, age, socioeconomic status...none of these make a difference. Of those who survive, 95% can expect a significant side effect by the age of 45. Despite these numbers, less than 4% of cancer donations goes to childhood cancer research.

All donations are appreciated and are needed, regardless of the amount. However, for individuals and clubs who assist in a larger capacity, there are two recognition awards that we provide. For every \$100 a club donates to the OLPCF in a Lions Year, the club will be recognized with a banner patch the first year and banner pins in subsequent years, acknowledging the contributions they have made. These donation amounts are recorded, and when the amount gets to \$500, an additional award is presented. Any individual or club that donates \$500, either in lump sum or over time, will receive the OLPCF "Journey of Hope" Award, which can be kept by the donor or presented to a worthy individual for their service to others.

Thank you for your consideration of making a difference with your donation. We hope you will help us fight pediatric cancer...for their future.


Global Membership Team



To be on the ballot: MD13 Ohio Lions 2024 State Convention Ballot Question: Shall the International Relations Committee be removed from Article III, Section 5, page 18 of the MD-13 Ohio Lions By-Laws, of the most recent version dated July 29, 2023 and the MD-13 Ohio Lions Policy Manual Section 1, Chapter 5, page 4?

Rationale: Based on a recommendation from the Finance & Long-Range Planning Committee. The function of the International Relations Committee has recently become moot as one of the main beneficiaries of their funding is no longer in existence at Kent State University.

If approved by a 2/3 majority of registered delegates at the MD-13 Ohio Lions 2024 State Convention, this measure will become effective July 1, 2024
