Dr Hill is a founding member of the Lions of Canada Consultative Committee. In recognition of her service to the association, International President Hill has received numerous awards, including several International President's Awards. She has been honored with the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor the association bestows upon its members. She is also a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow, and recipient of numerous other fellowships. In addition to her Lions activities, International President Hill is active in numerous professional, human rights, and community organizations. In the past, she served as an executive officer of the Alberta Association of School Psychologists and the Association of Canadian Educators of the Hearing Impaired, International President Hill has also served on the Alberta Premier's Council on Persons with Disabilities. Where did February go? What a month. We had a successful Council of Governors Meeting in Grove City at which many pressing issues were decided by the District Governors. Foremost, the DG's approved the language of an issue to be voted on at the MD13 State Convention in May asking the delegates in attendance to decide whether the International Relations Committee remain as part of the MD13 Structure. A second issue approved by the DG's was the language to consider whether to add in the MD13 Policy Manual an unfunded position of New Voices Coordinator to the Global Action Team. PDG Rob Murry informed the DG's that he was retiring from his position as Assistant MD13 Treasurer, and the DG's approved the nomination of PDG Randy Goff to replace Rob beginning July 1, 2024. PDG Rob also announced his intention to step down from the MD13 Liaison Committee, effective the end of June, so DG's will select a replacement for that position at the State Convention. MD13 Lions and OH3 have been blessed by the leadership and service PDG Rob Murry has provided in these two important offices, as well as the OH3 CST, over many years. Thank you, Lion Rob, thank you. We are close to moving into positive numbers in membership growth for the first time this century! We are currently only 15 members in the red, if you are familiar with accounting terminology. There are many things we can do to put us in the black. We can embrace the Recruiter's Passport Program. Lions who have received this handy guide to recruiting new members have been quite enthusiastic about it. We can accept the Council Chair Challenge to finish the year +2 or better in membership in our clubs. We can invite non-Lions to join us in our service

projects. We can put our new members to work and make sure they feel welcome and essential to the life of our clubs. We can make sure we have sufficient orientation to both new and longtime members about how our club, our district and our international organization function. We can remind members who have sponsored new Lions that their duty does not end when the new Lions are installed. We can recognize that not all our members have the same skills and motivations in being part of our organization and work to take advantage of those areas in which they are adept. In other words, growing by adding members is important, but keeping members by following the WE SERVE of Lionism is why we exist.





We all like sharing what our club has done and will be doing but why are we only sharing this information with other Lions?

We need to share our activities, fundraisers, etc., with our communities on other than Lions pages. Your club pages are great but who sees them? Most viewers on the Lions pages are Lions. Have you ever tried sharing something on your local community pages? For example, pages like the Anything Everything Huber Heights page or Reynoldsburg Get Involved. These are just two examples of many community Facebook pages. Search in your area, city, county, or township and then "like" or "join" them and share what you're doing on those pages. Even your City, Police and Fire Department have pages. Your club may not be able to post on these, but you can send them a message and ask them to post your activities. They are usually happy to do it as they know how much you give back to your communities. If not, then it is time to invite them in for a club meeting for a two-way exchange of information. They tell you what they are doing in your communities, and you tell them what you do for your communities to include your service activities, funds donated, fundraisers, etc. This is a win, win!

Remember to advertise, advertise, advertise! Take photos of what you are doing, write short articles and promote yourselves. Getting the word out to your communities helps get people to attend your events and know the good things you do each and every day.

Why do we join a Lions Club? Most people will tell you it is to "serve" and usually it is to serve in their community to help those in need. Of course, after you join lions, you realize that we make a difference everywhere around the world with our kind and serving hearts. Service is so important to the success of our clubs and to serve those in need which accomplishing our lions motto of "We Serve". Why do we need to do service projects? It provides an avenue to advertise, get ourselves out there and to serve our communities, individuals, and areas around the world with critical services that are needed.

- 1. Most of us do our state "Fall Into Service" project but what do you do outside of that to serve your community and the world? We all know that we must have members to do service. Don't be afraid to ask someone that is not a lion to come join in on a project and who knows, they might become a lion.



Glasses Collections and Drop Off's to Glass Collection POCs

Collecting used glasses to include prescription, sunglasses and reading glasses are one of the many tasks that our Lions do. If you collect glasses, please contact one of our Eye Glasses Collection POCs (Lions Patrick Bookman (513-689-2379) and Mike Hathaway (740-703-3943)) to get them to them. Please do not wait until you have 20,000 pairs. You can make arrangements to meet them, have them attend a club meeting and talk about the program, meet them at a Zone meeting, etc. Sometimes, a Zone Chairperson will even collect them for the POCs, but you need to make sure you arrange this prior to bringing a bunch of glasses to a meeting for them to take. The glasses are an important part of the Lions vision program, and it does us no good to hold on to them. They need to be collected and taken to our POCs so that they can get them out to those in need of them. Sight should never be taken for granted and if we can help someone see better, we have done a great service. Please ensure that all glasses are counted and boxed up (no bags please).

- Packing boxes should be marked with the number of glasses contained and the name of the club supplying them.
- Packing boxes should be of manageable size (20 to 30 pounds).
- Clubs delivering glasses to the collection points should submit their MAR information for credit. The collection point will not do that for individual clubs.

Greetings from the OLPCF (Ohio Lions Pediatric Cancer Foundation).

The OLPCF was founded in 2019 to fill several needs relating to pediatric cancer: to help fund, through grants, research to provide cures; to provide financial assistance to families dealing with a child who has cancer; and to provide a tax-exempt restricted fund option for clubs who are working with other foundations and/or families in need.

To date, we have been able to provide \$25,000 grants in each of our first 3 years in existence, and we have helped a number of families as well. As we continue to grow, our ability to reach out will be even greater.

Pediatric cancer is actually over 100 diseases lumped under one umbrella. It is the #1 killer by disease in children. 17,000 children are diagnosed every year in the United States alone, with the average age of 10 at the time of diagnosis, and the symptoms can often be very subtle and easy to miss. Gender, race, age, socioeconomic status...none of these make a difference. Of those who survive, 95% can expect a significant side effect by the age of 45. Despite these numbers, less than 4% of cancer donations goes to childhood cancer research.

All donations are appreciated and are needed, regardless of the amount. However, for individuals and clubs who assist in a larger capacity, there are two recognition awards that we provide. For every \$100 a club donates to the OLPCF in a Lions Year, the club will be recognized with a banner patch the first year and banner pins in subsequent years, acknowledging the contributions they have made. These donation amounts are recorded, and when the amount gets to \$500, an additional award is presented. Any individual or club that donates \$500, either in lump sum or over time, will receive the OLPCF "Journey of Hope" Award, which can be kept by the donor or presented to a worthy individual for their service to others.

Thank you for your consideration of making a difference with your donation. We hope you will help us fight pediatric cancer...for their future.






